- Children should spend no more than 10 minutes a day on spellings and/or times tables.

#### What is expected

#### Children will follow the school rules:

# In addition to the school rules, children should follow the classroom rules:

#### **Attendance and punctuality**

- Attending school regularly is very important.
- Missed days have a massive impact on your child's learning.
- Your child needs to be at school, in their seat and ready to learn at 8:55am. If they do not answer the school register, they are deemed to be **late**. It is very distressing for children when they are late.
- Children who are absent for lengthy periods (holidays etc.) will have work set aside for them, which can be completed at home, to make up for lost learning.

#### **General reminders**

- Children <u>must</u> read every day.
- This must be monitored in the children's home school diary.
- Please inform us, in writing, of any appointments, absences or change of pick-up arrangement in the home school diary.
- Children must have their PE kit in school every day. Earrings, watches, fitbits etc. must be taken out for PE.
- Children should have all the *necessary equipment* in a pencil case, so that they are ready to learn.
- Children should bring a water bottle to school every day.
- All uniform should be name-labelled.



# **Necessary equipment for school**

#### KS2 children should have:

- HB pencils
- Coloured pencils
- Ruler
- Eraser
- Pencil sharpener
- Glue stick

Large, distracting pencil cases are not permitted.



#### **Packed lunches**
