This letter will inform you of all the exciting things your child will be learning about, over the next half term.

#### General Reminders:

Please note that the current spellings are from the Year 3 & 4 statutory spellings list.

Spellings and Times Tables will be tested on Fridays. Children should practise both at home daily.

#### Curriculum:

Our over-arching topic up until Christmas is 'Mesopotamia'. We have chosen this topic to allow the children to explore a different way of living and how they have influenced the world. It is important for children to know that our culture is influenced by the thoughts and beliefs of others. We will be reading 'Varjak Paw' by SF Said, which links with our topic, along with other extracts of a variety of text types to supplement.
