General Reminders:

Children must bring the following equipment into school every day:

There are 20 spellings in total – 15 follow a 'spelling rule/pattern' and 5 are statutory spellings.

Spellings and Times Tables will be tested on <u>Wednesdays</u>. Children should practise both at home daily.
