

Reception — Autumn Curriculum letter

A warm welcome to Reception! We hope you had an enjoyable summer break. We are looking forward to an exciting year ahead!

To keep you up to date with what we are doing in our learning, we will be uploading observations and information regarding what we will be learning in class each week on to Tapestry. You will receive a log in to this soon.

Within this newsletter you will find information regarding what topics we will be covering for the first term of the year and what we will be covering in our areas of learning.

General reminders

Please ensure that your child's clothing is clearly labelled with their name. This includes their PE Kit and shoes if possible.

Please make sure that your child has a water bottle in school every day, again making sure that it is clearly labelled. If your child is having packed lunches please ensure this is labelled too.

Our PE day will be announced in September, so children can come into school in their PE kits all day on that day every week. Jewellery must be removed.

The children just need to bring their blue school book bag to school each day which will have their phonics notebook in, orange reading record and book. These need to be in school each day. The school expectation is that children will read at home 4 times a week, these need to be recorded in the children's orange reading records. All that needs to be written is the title of book, the page they read up to and a little comment about how they read. More about this will be explained at our phonics and reading workshop.

Within reception we do encourage that you leave a bag at school with spare uniform in - in case the children need to change. These bags can be taken home every half term.

The children will have access to the garden every day, in all weathers. Please provide your child with a pair of wellies that can stay at school. If you wish you may also provide some waterproofs that your child can keep at school too.

If there is a change to pick up arrangements it is vital that you let us know. An email to the office is essential.
