

This books links in really nicely with the "Zones of regulation" - which is something we are beginning to use in our school to help children regulate their emotions. We will be doing lots of activities on the day, linked with this book, as well as having a chance to just explore and celebrate the love of reading!

As part of our Literacy lessons we were learning how to write a simple sentence. We tried our hardest and remembered to use our phonic sounds to help us!

Atlantic Ocean. This significant person! We about her.

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



As part of our Expressive Arts and Design learning we have been very creative. We have learnt to join in new ways, using split pins and treasury tags.

We used the split pins to create our astronauts when we were learning all about space.



We used treasury tags to make books about different map symbols. We know that a map symbol is used to visually represent a feature on a map. We used google maps to look at lpswich and saw lots of different symbols which we then drew into our handmade books.



We have also been learning how to use watercolours. We were a little confused when Mrs Goodwin showed us the dry paint but then the magic happened when she added the water and the paint came alive! We had great fun mixing the colours and creating a picture of transport.



We also enjoyed learning all about Lunar New Year. We learnt that the Emperor (who is like the King) wanted a way to tell the time. He made the animal's race and the first 12 animals across the finish line, had a year named after them.
