
Friday 24^{th} June — Arts week school event, our classroom galleries will be open to parents from 3.15pm - 5pm.



Reception have been working hard on their numbers and have been making doubles. They were using Numicon, diagrams and writing to show their learning. Good job everyone!




YEAR I:

ENGINEERING CHALLENGE:

MARBLE RUN



The brief

Use a cardboard box and cardboard struts to create a marble run. The marble must run for 60 seconds.


The method

- Use sticky tape to attach the cardboard struts to the cardboard box, creating a run for the marble.
- Place the marble at the top of the run and time how long it takes for it to reach the bottom.
- Keep improving your design until the marble takes exactly 60 seconds to reach the bottom.

Top tip

If you can't find cardboard struts, make your own by folding four inch wide strips of cardboard in half to create a V shape.





Materials

Large cardboard box Cardboard struts Sticky tape Marbles

Scissors (with adult supervision)

How does it work?

To help you to control
the time your marble
takes to run its course
you'll need to consider
a few factors:

Potential energy = mass x gravity x height The heavier your marble and higher your slope, the mare energy your

Friction

The rougher or stickle the surface, the slower your marble will travel

Angle of the slop

The less steep the angle of the slope, the longer the morble will take to reach the battom.



Your guide to safer parking outside schools

POOR AND INCONSIDERATE PARKING CLOSE TO SCHOOLS CAN PLACE CHILDREN AT RISK

Most accidents involving children outside schools occur when a child has their sight obscured by parked cars.

Parking restrictions and marked areas on the roads are there for a reason – to keep children safe. The safest option when dropping or picking your children up is to park away from the school and take a short walk to the gates.

If you must park near to school and space is limited, please follow the rules:

- · Do NOT park on zig-zag lines or KEEP CLEAR markings
- · Do NOT park on yellow line restrictions
- · Do NOT park across dropped kerbs or drives
- · Do NOT park on footpaths
- · Do NOT stop to drop kids off in the centre of the road

Failure to follow these rules may result in a Penalty Charge Notice being issued.

Please park safely and be considerate of children and residents by not causing an obstruction
