The hours are 11.4-Oam - 12.50pm (70mins per day); five days per week.


The current hourly rate is £10.98 (subject to pay rise in negotiation) for 38 weeks per year (plus 5 weeks paid holiday).

MEET OUR SCHOOL COUNCIL:

Our School Council is a student body that works to make improvements to different areas of the school, including a focus on environmental sustainability.

Our School Councillors are democratically elected at the start of each academic year and then work on the School Council for all of that year. Any children can put themselves forward to be part of the School Council.

During the first School Council meeting the children devise a School Council Charter stating all of the responsibilities they will undertake to fulfil their roles effectively.

The School Council then meets every 3 weeks to discuss issues within the school and to work on future projects.

The School Councillors meet with their classes between meetings to discuss ideas, projects and issues and they then feedback to the rest of the School Council members during our meetings. Each term the School Council will complete an action plan of things they aim to work on and achieve by the end of that term.

Our staff team had a wonderful coffee morning to raise money for Macmillan Cancer Support. We had some truly wonderful cake!




FREE 'Come and Play Days' for county level music groups




SPOTLIGHT ON YEAR 4

Maths


In maths we have been exploring place value and number. We have worked hard to set out our work correctly so that we can see the steps we have taken to solve mathematical problems. We have enjoyed experimenting using base 10 and Gattequo charts.





English


We have started to explore our new English curriculum and started the term with re-visiting what strong sentences look like. We have explored Haiku and Cinquain poetry, as well as working hard to learn the grammatical structure and features required to write a persuasive advert, reminding people of the dangers of meeting up with somebody we meet online. We have also been concentrating really hard on the presentation of our written work as we all needed to improve (including, Mr. Bentley!).



RE

Our learning in RE has been learning about The Bible and how this sacred text encourages us to follow the teachings of Jesus. We have learnt how to find stories in the Bible and have looked at the Story of Abraham and Moses. We enjoyed making our own Bible Covers for children.






Art

In art we have been exploring with different mark making and understanding the terms 'contour' and 'pattern'. We have learnt to create effects to make 2D drawings appear 3D.

Improving SEND Services in Suffolk: Our SEND strategy

Our current Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) 2021–23 Strategy has been the basis of our work to improve SEND Services over the last three years, and as it comes to an end we want to ask as many people as possible their opinion about what we should concentrate on next.

We believe our work so far has begun and will continue to make outcomes better for children and young people, but we also know that the lived experience of many families has yet to improve. We must make sure that our new strategy continues to address this. We want to keep on doing the things that are working, identify where there are gaps, and understand what else we need to be doing to address these.

Medication Shortage

Information regarding national supply disruptions to ADHD medications:

You may have heard about a national shortage of some of the medicines used to treat ADHD. These supply problems are expected to resolve at various dates between October and December 2023.

How does this affect me/my child?

Although not all ADHD medicines are affected by this shortage, our records indicate that you/your child is currently being prescribed one or more of the medicines that are likely to be in short supply, or possibly unavailable.

What do I need to do?

The NHS is working hard to manage this shortage, but there are a few things that you can do to help us minimise the effect on you/your child:

- 1. Please only order your prescription when you have 10-14 days of your medicine left. It is important not to stockpile medicines, and your doctor will not be able to issue your prescription any earlier.
- 2. If your usual pharmacy is not able to supply your medication, please try calling or visiting other local pharmacies to locate stock. Pharmacy contact details can be found via Find a pharmacy NHS (www.nhs.uk).

Patients currently taking Medikinet, Ritalin, Concerta XL, Xaggitin XL, Delmosart XL, Affenid XL, Xenidate XL, Matoride XL, Amfexa, Strattera:

- I. Be prepared that your medicine may look a little different to normal:
- You may be asked to take different strengths of your medicine to make up the full dose.

- If your usual medicine is not available, your GP should be able to give you a prescription for a different medicine that works in the same way and is still available.
- Any change to your medicine will be short-term, and only until the supply problems are resolved.

Patients currently taking Medikinet XL, Ritalin XL, Metyrol XL, Equasym XL, Addepta XL, Elvanse, Elvanse Adult, Intuniv:

- I. Your GP <u>cannot</u> prescribe you an alternative medicine, if you are unable to find a pharmacy which can dispense your prescription, please contact us so that we can refer to the specialist ADHD team to manage your treatment.
- 2. While we wait for supplies of your medicine to become available again, you may need to change to a different treatment or management plan. Your specialist will discuss the options available to you and agree on the best way to manage your ADHD until your usual medicine is available again.

Where can I go for further information?

If you've received a medicine which looks different to what you normally receive, your community pharmacist is best placed to provide information on it. Rest assured that any changes should only be visual, and act the same as your old medication unless directed by the ADHD specialist team.
