## **Amazon Smile fundraising -**

The PTA have just signed up to Amazon Smile. This is a cash back scheme specifically for Amazon accounts and raises money for the school while you shop.

It costs you nothing, and if you use Amazon please do set this up. There are a couple of initial steps and then it should be zero effort after that and each purchase will raise money for the school.

Here's how:

- 1. Go to Smile.amazon.co.uk
- 2. Log in as normal to your Amazon.
- 3. Search for St Mary's Parent and Teachers Association. Once selected this will stay as your nominated charity.
- 4. Shop as normal through the link Smile.amazon.co.uk.

#### That's it!

You can't use Amazon Smile with the Amazon App on the iPhone. However, the good news is that you can set up a shortcut to the Amazon Smile website which gives a near identical experience to the app. It's very quick and easy to do.

- 1. If you have the Amazon App installed you should remove it. To do this, tap and hold the app icon until it starts to jiggle. Tap the cross at the top left of the icon and confirm that you want to delete it. Don't worry, this will not delete your Amazon account or any of your settings.
- 2. Open Amazon smile on safari.
- 3. Tap the 'share' button at the bottom of the screen (looks like this):
- 4. Tap the 'Add to Home Screen' icon. You may need to swipe to the left to see this.
- 5. You will now have an Amazon Smile icon on your home screen which you can use in exactly the same way you used the Amazon App.
