Sorry for any unkind things that we have said or done.



# YEAR 6:



WORLD BOOK DAY: Key date: World Book Day - 3rd March



#### SPORTS CLUBS:


All clubs started this week. Payment is due by 28<sup>th</sup> January please (via parentmail). Thank you
