

SPOTLIGHT ON World Book Day

This year, as a school, we will be focusing on the book: "The Colour Monster". This books links in really nicely with the "Zones of Regulation" – which is something we are beginning to use in our school to help children regulate their emotions. We will be doing lots of activities on the day, linked with this book, as well as having a chance to just explore and celebrate the love of reading!



Reception:

We love the story of The Colour Monster, in Reception, and were very excitied that this was our whole school story for WBD. We worked collaboratively to create the confused monster. The children were able to name all the emotions and we talked about how we can handle our emotions whilst we created the monster. I'm sure you'll agree it looks fabulous!



Year I:

In Year I, we enjoyed listening to the story of The Colour Monster and exploring the colour yellow and the happiness this colour brings. We designed our own birds using a range of different mediums. We hope that you love how fabulous they look.




Year 2:

Year 2 created some teardrop and cloud shapes with watercolours and collage in the colour blue, to represent the blue monster from our school story. We also made some stories to go along with some of the different coloured monsters.



Year 3:

Year 3 were given the colour Pink from the book 'The Colour Monster' to think about how that colour made them feel. Words the children used to describe their pink feelings were: caring, loving, supportive, friendly and helpful. We painted, collaged, drew and wrapped pink hearts/monsters and blossom branches to represent these feelings. We also wrote book reviews of 'The Colour Monster' and chose our favourite parts as well as making our own book marks.



Year4:

Year 4 enjoyed reading The Colour Monster and exploring the colour green and the calmness and tranquillity surrounding the colour. We designed our own colour monsters and only used leaf, clover and grass patterns to show their features. Later in the afternoon, the whole class created a 3D calmness curtain using different materials and weaved our mini monsters within. How amazing to be surrounded by such calmness.



Years 5:

Year 5 en joyed reading The Colour Monster today and made links to this and our Zones of Regulation in school. Year 5's theme for a whole school display was red for anger. Here they are dressed up in colours of their choice.





Year6:

Year 6's theme was black for fear. We also created our own board games based on books we know and there was even a merging of stories! We loved dressing up in our chosen colours.











FREE SCHOOL MEALS:

Your child will get free school meals if you receive any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit but no element of Working Tax Credit and have an annual income (as assessed by HM Revenues & Customs) that does not exceed £16,190
- If you are supported under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Working Tax Credit during the four-week period immediately after your employment finishes or after you start to work fewer hours per week

Are you entitled?

Free

Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400 (£616.67 per month), as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods).

THINK BEFORE YOU PARK:



POOR AND INCONSIDERATE PARKING CLOSE TO SCHOOLS CAN PLACE CHILDREN AT RISK

Most accidents involving children outside schools occur when a child has their sight obscured by parked cars.

Parking restrictions and marked areas on the roads are there for a reason – to keep children safe. The safest option when dropping or picking your children up is to park away from the school and take a short walk to the gates.

If you must park near to school and space is limited, please follow the rules:

- · Do NOT park on zig-zag lines or KEEP CLEAR markings
- · Do NOT park on yellow line restrictions
- Do NOT park across dropped kerbs or drives
- · Do NOT park on footpaths
- · Do NOT stop to drop kids off in the centre of the road

Failure to follow these rules may result in a Penalty Charge Notice being issued.

Please park safely and be considerate of children and residents by not causing an obstruction
