CAFOD EMERGENCY UKRAINE HUMANITARIAN APPEAL:



YEAR 5:


 ${\it Y}ear$ 5 did a great job turning their papier-mache

FLOATING PAPER CLIP	SCIENCE CHALLENGE 15 Designed by Nor, Test engineer at Dyson
 The brief Make a paper clip float on water. The method 1. Fill the bowl with water. 2. Tear off some tissue paper (around 10cm x 5cm). 3. Genly place the tissue paper onto the surface of the water so that it floats. 4. Place the dry paper clip on top of the tissue. 5. Use the rubber end of the pencil to carefully poke until the tissue sinks and the paperclip is left floating. 	Materials Water A bowl Tissue paper A paper clip A pencil with a rubber on the end
How does it work? The paper cip is held alload by the surface tention of the water. Water molecules are polar, so the molecules pull on each other. This reades a tention - like a thin, flexible membrane on the surface - which helps hold the readle alloat. The tissue apper cilowy sput to lower the apparetip onto the water gently, without breaking the surface tension. Did you know? Insects such as poind skaters use water tension to appear to walk on water.
