At St Mary's our Year 6 Worship Council and Minnie Vinnies led each class through the Stations of the Cross. At each Station the children were able to reflect, pray and think about the moments which led to Jesus' death. All the children, at each station, said these words: "Because by your Holy Cross you have redeemed the world." These words really helped the children reflect upon the meaning of the stations. Our photos show Year6 pupils supporting Year I through this special trail.

The prayer that the children said together at the ninth Station was one that really made them reflect and think deeply:

"Jesus, you felt the darkness around you, the crowds surrounded you.

You fell once more.

Walk with us.

When we lose hope, when everything is just too difficult, shows us how to reach out to each other and hold hands so that none of us have to do everything on our own.

Help us to know that you walk alongside us even when we feel most alone."

# **SPOTLIGHT ON YEAR 2**

# RE

This term we have begun our learning about Holy Week. We have learned that Jesus entered Jerusalem on a donkey and was greeted by lots of people with palm leaves. We have begun to learn about the Stations of the Cross and visited the church on Thursday afternoon.



# DT

We had great fun designing our cars out of recycled materials. We thought hard about our chassis, axles and wheels. Once we'd made our cars, we had races in the Willow Garden!













# HISTORY

We have been learning about the history of Felixstowe, including what happened in 1953 — The Great Flood of Felixstowe! We role-played as experts trying to warn the local people about what would happen.



ART

We have been recapping our drawing techniques this term. We have been learning how to stipple, crosshatch, dash and swirl to create interesting effects.



# WRITING/SCIENCE

We created non-chronological reports to support our science learning on materials. We have learned that there are lots of different materials that have different properties. For example, glass is usually transparent and brittle, whereas metal is opaque and durable.



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# ART/GEOGRAPHY

In geography we have been learning about Nairobi in Kenya and how it compares to London. We learned about the Masaai tribe and created some facepaint artwork and pointillism patterns.
