# HELP SHAPE THE FUTURE OF LIBRARY SERVICES IN SUFFOLK



Thank you for the beautiful hampers made up of your generous donations, the donated cakes and lucky bags and soft drinks, which meant we had an incredible selection to offer, thanks to everyone who took the time to buy raffle and disco tickets, to pay it forward, to send in money, to come to the events, to run their children back-and-forth from school, to come in and spend some money at the fair, we are grateful for each and every one of you.

Thanks to you all we have raised an amazing amount of money. Between the school disco and the Christmas Fair, we took over  $\pounds 2000$ . After costs have been taken out, we have a minimum profit of  $\pounds 1779.45$  which is an incredible achievement for two half day events. This will go towards our target for the brand-new history wall that is being installed on the playaround, it looks like it's going to be a fantastic learning resource for all the children.

We still have a couple of matched funding applications pending from volunteers, so the figure will end up being even more. We will report it in the New Year. Many big companies offer matched funding schemes, where they will pledge to match an amount of money that their employee has helped raise for a registered charity like us.

If you work for a company that offers matched funding, and you would like to help the Friends of Saint Mary's, please get in touch via the school office. I can help you with any application and it is usually very straightforward. We have had incredible support from companies like Microsoft, Barclays, Ellisons, HSBC, Lloyds and others, it can almost double the amount we raise, so it's always worth checking.

# SPOTLIGHT ON RECEPTION

Reception have settled into school so well this term. We have been very busy with lots of learning and activities. We read 'The Gingerbread Man', pretended to be bakers and baked our own gingerbread. It was great to measure ingredients and use our fine motor skills to roll and cut up the gingerbread.





We also read the story 'Pumpkin Soup' and scooped out all the insides and roasted the pumpkin seeds that we found. These were a particular hit at snack time!

We have been learning about numbers through the number blocks and learning that parts can make up a whole through pictures, then using a small part whole model to make five. We looked at different ways we could make 5, beginning to see patterns and manipulate numbers.





Reception have read 'The Three Little Pigs'. We were challenged to build a house that the Big Bad Wolf could not blow down or even lean on! We had to make sure our wooden block houses were strong and secure. We did a great job whilst thinking about the properties of materials.

We tested out our houses to see if people could get in.



We also made mini houses built from sticks, straws and mini bricks to see which was the strongest.







We created stick puppets to act out the story of the three little pigs. We did some fabulous writing using our phonics. Reception are doing really well at learning their phonics and practising their letter formation.

Reception performed our Nativity to parents in the school hall. I was so proud of all them. They learnt lines to say and songs to sing and remembered where they had to be on stage — what a great experience for them all!



Reception read the book 'It's a No Money Day' which is a story of a family who use a foodbank. We discussed how anyone can use a foodbank and thought what it's like to be really hungry. We made a class donation box of items for the local foodbank and we role played what a foodbank may be like. It was good that the children had a chance to think of others at this time of year. We also made a class book of Kindness — children stuck in a heart with a small message of kindness, to remind us all through the year.
