In English, Year 6 have been busy learning to write speeches, narratives and explanatory texts and have developed many grammatical skills along the way.

In PSHE, the children showed great skill in their managing money lesson—I am impressed with their budgeting skills!

In Science, Year 6 have enjoyed their learning about the heart and how to stay healthy. They have completed their own investigation and presented their data in graphs.

In Art, the children have developed their printmaking skills—focusing on perspective and creating this in their designs first. They then were able to transfer these skills and apply their designs onto fabric using batik.
