#### **Fundraising**

This term the Fundraising Committee would like to involve every class in a group activity. The charity **Action for Churches in Need (ACN)** is working hard to support families and children who have been forced to leave their homes through war or natural disaster.



They have a programme called **Maisy Milk** where each class uses an empty milk bottle to collect spare change. The Fundraising Committee have decorated bottles and presented the project at Assembly today.

Through a simple act of bringing in any spare change they (or you!) have, just a few pennies here and there, the children can feel pride in being part of the wider community, taking action to help those less fortunate than themselves.

Showing kindness, being an active citizen in our local and wider communities is a big priority at St Mary's and I know you will support this project generously. #### Reminders

#### Safeguarding: collecting your child/children at the end of the day

Please make sure that you come into the playground to collect your child at the end of the school day. You will have seen that the children now line up with their teacher in front of their relevant class number painted on the brick wall in the playground. Please ensure you collect your child/children promptly, and move away from the line so that the teacher can see clearly the children still waiting in the line. If your child is being collected by someone other than their regular person, please ensure you write a note in their home school diary. Children will not be released to another adult at the end of the day without your written permission. This includes waiting in your car whilst another parent collects your child. In cases where arrangements are changed during the school day, the office must be notified by 2pm that day. If your child is not attending a session of their after-school club for any reason, please write in the home school diary and let the school office know.

#### **Lost Property**

Please ensure all items of your child/children's clothes are clearly labelled. We do not keep a traditional 'lost property box' but try to return unclaimed items as soon as possible to their owners — this is only possible if there are names on the items.

Unclaimed items are eventually given to the PTA for recycling or thrown away.

#### <u>Jewellery</u>

Jewellery is not appropriate for school wear. Pupils with pierced ears may wear small studs but these need to be removed for PE. If a child is unable to remove their earrings due to initial healing time, micropore tape (or equivalent) needs to be provided for the child to cover their earrings please.


