RECEPTION:


This week Reception have been making ocean models and using some of the stories we have been reading for their sea creature inspirations! The children worked collaboratively to create these and did a fabulous job.



YEAR I:

In maths we have been sharing into equal groups. We have done this practically using counters and also in our books. Some children have been applying these methods to help them problem solve. In science we have been thinking about wild plants and garden plants. We went on a walk around school to see what plants we could fine and completed some observational drawings.





YEAR 2:

In English, Year 2 have been examining character descriptions. We analysed a character description of the Big Bad Wolf, picking out the adjectives, noun phrases, commas and adverbs. We then had a go at creating our own character description for a witch or a wizard.


YEAR 3:


