

Census Day:

The school census day will be Thursday 7th October and we need as many children to have a school meal that day as possible as the more we have the more funding the school is given for resources etc. The menu that day will be pizza or vegetable curry. We will be giving a meal to all children in Reception, Year1 and Year2 for them to try to see if they like school meals.



Open Days for Reception 2022 Parents:

We will be holding an open morning on 3rd November at 9.15am and an open afternoon on 4th November at 1.30pm. Please book an appointment for one of these dates with the school office. Each session will be restricted to 15 adults and only 1 adult per family will be permitted.



Reception 2022/2023:

The application portal is now open with Suffolk County Council for parents to apply for their child's Reception class for children starting school in September 2022/2023.

We require a Supplementary Information Form that will need to be completed and returned to the office at school before the deadline 15th January 2022. Any SIF's received after this date will be dealt with as a late application.

Wrap Around Care:

Wrap around care has begun and we wanted to remind families that it is available to you all, it is flexible each week with no commitment to use all the time. The school are committed to running the care for a full year before a decision is made on the future of the provision.

If you wish to book a space please return a completed booking form to the school office by 2pm every Friday. Payments will need to be made by in advance of care for your child to attend.

Named Items:

Please make sure that all items, jumpers, lunch boxes, wattle bottles, book bags, that belong to your child have their names clearly printed in them so we can return lost items to the correct owner. We have many children looking for their lost unnamed items that we aren't able to reunite them quickly.

Please check the High School you wish to apply to, to see if they require you to complete a Supplementary Information Form. Completed SIF's will need to be returned to your chosen school by the closing date 31st October 2021.



Reception:

This week Reception have been talking about the seasons. Following on from the children's interests in the seasons we have created this beautiful tree showing the four different seasons of the year. All the children helped to create this which shows fabulous collaboration!



Year 1:

In Year 1 literacy this week we read "The Sound Collector" by Roger McGough. We went on a sound hunt and the children collected some of their own sounds. They then used the sounds they had collected to write their own rhyming poem.

Year 2:

In Computing, Year 2 are learning how to make music using computers. We learned about rhythm and patterns and created our own using Chrome Music Labs. It was great fun listening to our patterns.



Year 3:

In Re this week, we formed a 'conscience alley' and all the children got into role, helping to advise a character trying to choose between right and wrong. We based our dilemma on the guidance provided by St Paul in his letter to the Ephesians. Through debate and discussion, the children made sensitive and emotionally intelligent suggestions showing they have a strong moral compass. Well done year 3!



Year 4:

Year 4 had fun using viewfinders to zoom in on the detail of the objects they were sketching. They then investigated the "negative space" between the lines and used crayon to put pattern and design in that not-so-empty space. Very deep!



Year 5:

Year 5 have been learning about what a co-creator and de-creator are in R.E. We came up with examples of each and put these into making our own board games! We had lots of fun playing each other's.



Year 6:

This week in RE, Year 6 were thinking about responding to the invitation to be a part of God's Kingdom. They thought about this carefully and were very reflective. They then produced modern-day role plays about responding to an invitation.

Annual Reviews of EHC Plans Webinar
