# YEAR 1

Wow how quickly this half term has gone! Come and take a look at the exciting things Year I have been getting up to this half term!

#### RE

In RE we have recently been focusing on prayer. We have learnt about the different signs and symbols we use as well as the different types of prayer there are! This week we enjoyed writing our prayers in the lovely sunshine and adding some colour to our outdoor area. Ask me what the 4 types of prayer are!







English

In English we have worked extremely hard to use features of a recount. We wrote about our visit to the church where we learnt about Baptism in RE. It is really pleasing to see the progress that the children have made since the start of the year!

#### **Mathematics**

In Mathematics we have recently finished our addition and subtraction block and are now working on Place Value within 20. We are enjoying using the variety of maths resources that we have in school. Yesterday we explored the different ways we can represent 10!




#### **PARENTS EVENINGS:**





