HIGH SCHOOL APPLICATIONS - Notice from SCC

Normal Year of Entry 2023/2024 – The closing date for secondary school places for September 2023 has now passed. To apply after the closing date, you must complete a paper application (CAFI). Any paper application received after the closing date will normally be treated as a late application. Sometimes there are very exceptional reasons why an application cannot be made by the closing date. This only applies in circumstances outside your control which made it impossible for the application to have been made on time. If you feel that this applies to you, please write to us giving all your reasons and include as much supporting evidence with your application to reach us by Tuesday 3 January 2023. Your evidence will be considered by a panel and each case will be decided individually. You will receive a letter telling you whether your application will be treated as late or on time.  CHILDREN'S



At St Mary's we are on our journey to becoming a rights respecting school. If you would like to know more about this we will be sharing some further information at the curriculum evening next week.

On Thursday 22^{nd} November, we kick-started this with a rights afternoon across the school. All classes from Reception up to Year 6 were looking at in some way the rights of a child. As time goes along we will be learning further about these rights and linking them to our lessons, assemblies and some of our policies too.

After Christmas, Mrs D-N will be starting a rights committee who will meet every few weeks to discuss rights see how they are represented in our school.

There are four key areas of impact for children at a Rights Respecting school; wellbeing, participation, relationships and self-esteem.

The difference that a Rights Respecting School makes goes beyond the school gates, making a positive impact on the whole community.

- Children are healthier and happier
- Children feel safe
- Children have better relationships
- Children become active and involved in school life and the wider world









The children are now well and truly established into Year 4 and have quickly realised that Year 4 is a large step up for them. They are all showing tremendous resilience and continue to show great learning behaviours.

PSHE

There have been a number of special events for us to focus and reflect on this term. Remembrance, Anti-Bullying Week, Black History Month, Red Wednesday and Childrens Rights and Respect Day. The children have engaged well within PSHE lessons and have listened attentively as well as asking pertinent questions.







Art

In Art we have explored the skill of overpainting and the effect of wet on wet with watercolours. We mixed secondary and tertiary colours to create our paintings. We have also explored the artwork of Georgia O'Keefe and compared it against another contempory artist.
