


READY TO LEARN



<u>RE</u>


In RE we have really been enjoying the new R.E.D curriculum. We have learnt about Jesus' life as a young boy, considering how we can be a light to others like Jesus, and this half term have focused on the lead up to Easter. We particularly enjoyed learning about Palm Sunday and enjoyed making our own palm leaves. We even tried to imagine what it would have been like for the people in Jerusalem welcoming Jesus!





<u>English</u>

I am sure many Year 1 Mummies can guess that we have been learning about informal letters. We really enjoyed having the opportunity to write lovely Mother's Day letters to our Mummy, we even got to stick the stamp on the envelope and post them ourselves!



Mathematics

In Mathematics we have been focusing on addition and subtraction and are now focusing on place value within 50. We enjoyed learning about doubles - we particularly like the doubles song: <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=8jOzhiACB68</u> (Take a listen and you will love it too!) Earlier this term we also looked at shape and tried to figure out how many triangles we could make from a number of straws. Perhaps you could try this at home!



<u>Science</u>

In Science we have learnt about different materials, considering the different properties of materials and which would be most suitable to make a raincoat from! More recently, we have been revisiting our learning module Animals including humans. We have had fun revisiting the knowledge that we looked at last term. This time we have experimented making our own bird beaks and have recently been on a search for amphibians - particularly after we had a visitor in our classroom a few weeks ago! You may have noticed we have a tub of frog spawn and some live tadpoles in our outdoor area, we are eagerly watching to see what happens!




<u>History</u>

In History we have been learning about the lives of significant people. We really enjoyed learning lots about David Attenborough and Mary Anning. We agreed that both of them are significant in their own ways because of what they have contributed.

<u>Geography</u>

In Geography we have begun our topic about hot and cold places - we have been thinking about why a place is hot and others cold since our Continent topic! We



have enjoyed using words such as equator and hemisphere to discuss the location of different areas of our planet. You may have seen our amazing drawings on the playground where we applied our learning about the location of the equator. We are now beginning to explore why it is hot close to the equator and colder in the polar regions!



<u>Computing</u>

In Computing we have been creating digital art and have been inspired by artists such as Van Gogh and Mondrian. We took time to compare digital art to hand made art work and identified similarities and differences between them.



Art and DT

In art we have been learning about the artist Katherine Hanson and learnt about her techniques to draw pictures of animals. We definitely share Katherine's love of animals in Year 1! In DT we really enjoyed our food unit when we got to make amazing fruit kebabs! They were super tasty and we enjoyed selecting and tasting the fruit! We also had great fun trying to make structures - we had to think carefully about how we could create a strong and stable structure.
