
# Newsletter


# TRIPS/SWIMMING DATES:

# **RECEPTION:**



Well done Year Three!






# YEAR 4:

Year 6 have really been enjoying our weekly dancing lessons. It has been so much fun!




#### SCIENCE CHALLENGE:
