Our celebrations will be happening on Friday 5th May, in the afternoon. We have the following activities planned:

- In the afternoon, on the playground, each child will have a biscuit and a glass of juice in a street party style celebration.
- During the afternoon, in class, the children will have various activities to complete to teach them more about the Coronation and what it means.



- The children can come into school wearing red, white or blue. They may even wear all 3 colours if they wish.
- There will be a Bake Off style competition for pupils and a separate one for staff. We would like participants to bake a nut free cake. In Reading, we have started to read some of Aesop's fables. We have been developing our skills of summarising, retrieving, predicting, inferring and sequencing.








HISTORY








SCIENCE

YEAR 3 & 4 SCHOOLS COUNTY FAIR:

On Thursday 20th April 2023, the children from year 3 and 4 were incredibly fortunate to be invited to attend the Suffolk School Farm and Country Fair at Trinity Park.

We started our day by visiting the Wildlife and Conservation Zone where we enjoyed visiting exhibits from the Suffolk Owl Sanctuary, Beekeepers, Wildlife Trust and Wild Play. We then moved to watch some of the gundogs who were showing their skills in the small arena before moving on to the first of the two food halls. Here we were able to sample some delicious venison burgers and sausages from the Ladies in Pigs. We moved on to the STEM Zone (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) to visit the stands provided by EDF Energy, Kinetic Science Foundation and Power Networks. Our next stop was The Sheep Show and a chance to have a snack and a sit down.

Later in the day we were able to go into the area with the Hamilton Bloodhounds and stroke a beautiful Suffolk Punch horse. We finished our exciting day by exploring the large machinery that farmers use and even a robot! Our final stop was the livestock area where we were able to view many cute, calves, kids, lambs, piglets, ponies, donkeys and alpacas. Some of us were also extremely lucky to talk to 'Princess Sophie Duchess of Edinburgh'

FOUNDATION GOVERNOR:






