
HIGH SCHOOL APPLICATIONS - Notice from SCC

Normal Year of Entry 2023/2024 – The closing date for secondary school places for September 2023 has now passed. To apply after the closing date, you must complete a paper application (CAFI). Any paper application received after the closing date will normally be treated as a late application. Sometimes there are very exceptional reasons why an application cannot be made by the closing date. This only applies in circumstances outside your control which made it impossible for the application to have been made on time. If you feel that this applies to you, please write to us giving all your reasons and include as much supporting evidence with your application to reach us by Tuesday 3 January 2023. Your evidence will be considered by a panel and each case will be decided individually. You will receive a letter telling you whether your application will be treated as late or on time. For more information about how to make a late application please go to www.suffolk.gov.uk/admissions.

Vaccination UK would like to offer parents, whose children missed the vaccine in School the opportunity to attend one of our 'Catch-up' Clinics.


We will be operating our clinics on a 'Walk-in' basis and therefore no appointment is necessary.

BECOMING A UNICEF UK RIGHTS RESPECTING SCHOOL: QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

It is an exciting time in the life of St Mary's school. We have embarked on a journey which will benefit the whole school community, from pupils and staff to parents and governors. Here's what we think you might like to know about it!

You might ask	As school leaders we think that
What is a Unicef UK Rights Respecting School?	When schools get involved, the children learn about their rights by putting them into practice every day.
	Children and adults will learn about the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) which outlines what children need to survive and thrive, becoming the best they can be and achieving their potential.
Why is this happening?	A Unicef UK Rights Respecting School models rights and respect in all its relationships, whether between adults and pupils, between pupils or between adults. It is proven to benefit everyone in the school community to grow and learn together. Read more about the Award at <u>www.unicef.org.uk/rrsa</u>
How will becoming a Rights Respecting School benefit my child(ren)?	This approach works in many schools across the country to improve well-being and develop every child's talents and abilities to their full potential. Headteachers from schools involved in the Award say it has improved children's and young people's respect for themselves and others and contributed to children and young people being more engaged in their learning.
How can I get involved?	We hope you will support the school's journey to become a Unicef UK Rights Respecting School. Please do read about the Convention and Unicef's work (see below) to see what it's all about!
What is the Convention on the Rights of the Child?	In 1989, governments worldwide promised all children the same rights by adopting the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child. The Convention recognised that all children have the right to be treated with dignity and fairness, to be protected, to develop to their full potential and to participate. The rights in the Convention describe what a child needs to survive, grow, and live up to their potential in the world. They apply equally to every child, no matter who they are or where they come from.

	The Convention changed the way children are viewed and treated – in other words, as human beings with a distinct set of rights instead of as passive objects of care and charity. It is the most widely ratified human rights treaty – only the United States has not ratified it. The UK signed up to it in 1991.

What is Unicef?	Unicef is the world's leading organisation for children and young people, promoting the rights and wellbeing of every child, in everything they do. Together with their partners, Unicef works in 190 countries to translate that commitment into practical action.
